#### Rantoukaku Art Museum



Works by renowned modern Japanese painters are displayed in this impressive building

The museum houses a permanent collection of more than 2,200 works, including oil paintings, traditional Japanese paintings, sketches, and wood-block prints by famous and local Japanese artists.

#### Shotoen Garden





Shotoen was named to reflect the beauty of the pine trees in the Japanese gardens enhanced by the view of the Sannose-Seto Strait. There are four museums on the site; each building has been either relocated elsewhere in Japan or restored.

### The Kamagari Guard House


Experiences the spirit of "Wabi" and "Sabi"

#### Hakusetsuro House





Hakusetsuro was originally in Kyoto in the 18th century. The house was converted into two stories in the mid-19th century, with the second floor once being used for the study of Chinese classics. It was donated to Shimokamagari in 1993, and took 2 years to rebuild. Timber remains the mark used for reconstruction. The interior displays ingenuity in its design, and of particular interest is the room with a secret escape, a rare examples of a style typical of the late Edo period.

#### Insect Museum





Displays include minute insects, Japanese dragonflies, local Shimokamagari insects, and endangered species in Hiroshima. There are events for making insect specimens are held during the summer holidays.
